Tournament Rules

Tournament Rules and Conduct

Surdel Family Day Tournament follows FIFA rules for youth competition. All games will adhere to FIFA rules with the following additions/clarifications:

- Interpretation of the tournament rules will be made by the Tournament Committee
- All decisions, judgements and calls made by the tournament officials are final
- No protests will be accepted in the tournament
- Game conduct is under the jurisdiction of the referee and the tournament officials will not overrule a referee's decision
- No player may compete in the Tournament on more than one team

Roster Submission/Team check-in

It is mandatory for all teams to check-in at least 45 minutes prior to their first game. The tournament headquarters will be situated at the Park you will be playing at in North Delta.

There will be no player additions to the team roster after the team checks in. A complete roster must be submitted and signed by the teams' coach or manager. The roster must also confirm that all players are registered with BC Soccer.

Team Conduct

- This tournament is for U6 - U18 Teams including Recreational, Prospects, Development, Select 1 & 2 Teams as well BCSPL, Metro, Gold and Silver Teams. Basically all levels of play from U6 – U18.
- Team coaches are directly responsible for the conduct of their players, team officials, parents and spectators at all times.
- If, in the opinion of tournament officials, a game must be stopped as a result of for the conduct of players, team officials, parents or spectators, the offending team can be suspended from further play and forfeit that game and all remaining games. In that event, all previous points earned remain as played
- Any coach or player ordered from the field of play including red cards will not be allowed to participate in the next match. If violent conduct occurs the player or coach may be ejected for the remainder of the tournament at the discretion of the Tournament Committee.
- Disciplinary measures for misconduct imposed by the Tournament Committee will be limited to placing restrictions upon an individual player, coach and spectator or team's participation in the tournament.
- Any team playing a suspended or an unregistered player will result in a team forfeit for the games in which the player played during the suspension.
